Farmworkers are at INCREASED RISK for:

- Heat-related illness
- Pesticide exposure
- Musculoskeletal injuries
- Green tobacco sickness
- Uncontrolled chronic illness
- Untreated depression and anxiety

But face many BARRIERS TO CARE:

- Transportation
- Cost
- Language
- Long work hours
- Frequent migration
- Discrimination
- Geographic and social isolation
